What career opportunities is the Health and Social Care sector responsible for?

What are the top apprenticeship opportunities?

Agricultural, Horticultural and Animal Care, Business, Administration and Law, Construction, Health, Public Services and Care.



What are the key skills you need to succeed in the region?

Communication, Teamwork, Problem-Solving, Flexibility, Determination.

Optional next step
